





A recent issue of 'You Are What You Ate' finds Morton Salt not agreeing with most of the points in Dr. Buckett's statement.

All salt may be considered 'sea salt' since the salt deposits are from prehistoric oceans. Iodized table salt contains potassium iodide and dextrose {a sugar} as a stabilizing agent for the iodine. Sodium bicarbonate may be used as a processing aid.

The minerals in sea salt are present in very small amounts which are nutritionally insignificant, so the health benefit differences between sea salt and table salt are negligible.

Food-grade salt must contain at least 97.5% sodium chloride. If a sea salt is grey, it likely contains impurities and may not meet food-grade requirements.

Salt that appears moist may also not meet food-grade requirements as the moisture limit for food-grade salt is 0.5%. If sea salt is pink or another color besides white, it may contain additives, such as Hawaiian alae rock or it may simply be dirty.

Response to - Morton Salt From - Andrea Buckett Dr. of Homeopathy

JO LEE Feature Columnist: 'YOU ARE WHAT YOU ATE'

While all salt may be considered 'sea salt" because of its prehistoric roots, it is the refinement of it that changes its nutritional profile. Refined, iodized table salt only contains sodium chloride {99.5%} and its respective fillers and flow agents {dextrose, sodium bicarbonate and potassium iodide.} Unrefined sea salt also contains mainly sodium chloride but also contains over 80 trace minerals. Nutritionally insignificant, I think not, as the body only requires these minerals in very small quantities. It is the complex nature of the salt in its natural whole form that is of value. Ultimately, getting rid of refined salt in the diet means getting rid of all the prepackaged, nutritionally void food - never a bad idea. Replacing those foods with ones that are nutritionally dense and seasoning them {in moderation} with sea salt is a step in the direction of well being. Culinary speaking sea salt has a much more rounded and robust flavor, thus using less of it is required.

#### « THE MARVELOUS MAVERICK

In Ancient Times, most people earned a livelihood through self-sufficient farming. When the crops failed, it wasn't because a corporation developed poor seeds, sold the wrong pesticide or failed to provide a reliable tractor. Natural disaster wasn't anybody's fault then -- the commercial technology and modern, performance-based institutions had not been invented yet.


Nowadays, modern life is urban and corporate. However, some people still self-sufficiently farm in isolated places and their vulnerability to natural disaster is still no-one's fault. There is no technology or corporation that could have protected the isolated people of north Pakistan from 2005's earthquake damage.

Many of the urban people of Pakistan died in this earthquake because the building codes were not strict enough or the existing codes were selectively applied due to corruption of local officials. In some towns, the public schools collapsed and the private ones remained standing. Less alignment between government and the services it provides is necessary to prevent this kind of tragedy.

Modern corporations exist to perform and a corporate mind-set develops to align its people and the corporate mission. Corporations emphasize narrow expertise, linear thinking and rational expectations, methods that

limit consideration of alternatives and the ability to act to reduce risk. The governments of the Indian Ocean countries had met previous to 2004's tsunami to consider a warning system like the one for the Pacific Ocean. They rejected the idea, not out of irresponsibility, but on the grounds of cost-ineffectiveness due to the absence of earthquake. Their error in this case was not corruption, but a collusive view of the world as rational and immune from the forces of nature.


Then there is New Orleans. There were numerous, scientifically-based warnings. There is the rule of law and honest government. How could the world's wealthiest and most creative nation let one of its major cultural centers sink?

Of the billions of dollars the United States spends on infrastructure per year, billions have gone to rural boondoggle projects and insufficient billions to levee repair. Why? I don't think the answer is 'corruption' in the sense that corporations are bribing officials to approve the wrong projects. Nor is the problem ignorance of risk -- Wall Street, after all, is in America. What went wrong is that the U.S. central government allocated resources in a political market place, taking urban resources to develop rural areas for purposes of national integration.

A nation may agree that wealth redistribution is affordable and enriching to the recipients. Even when there is alignment around this idea, limits persist despite a shared ideology. A nation's cities, the natural creators of wealth, need to stay above water.

## « THE REMARKABLE & PROMISING WORLD OF STEM CELLS


Unfortunately, the vast majority of people, including medical personnel, are unaware of the medical wonders of Umbilical Cord Blood Stem Cells. My desire is for this column to arm the reader with a better understanding of stem cells and of what types currently have multiple clinical applications and have already been utilized to save thousands of individuals, www.cordus.com

tem cells are the "mother of all cells" and are like "small factories", which have the ability to replicate or develop into many different cell types that make up the tissues and organs of the body. Stem cells can be found in multiple tissues, such as bone marrow, peripheral blood, skin, liver, fat, muscle, and embryonic tissue. Stem cells can also be found in umbilical cord blood.

Although many sources of stem cells hold uncertain promise for the future, it is the blood stem cell which has been in use for over twenty years to save tens of thousands of patients. Stem cells obtained from bone marrow or umbilical cord blood are characterized medically as blood stem cells. Over the past several years, scientists have learned that umbilical cord blood is a reliable alternative source for blood stem cells. Although greater volumes of bone marrow can be harvested, it was discovered that umbilical cord blood has 10 times the concentration of stem cells found within the bone marrow.

The blood stem cell is the precursor cell, which develops into red blood cells, white blood cells, and platelets.

- · Red blood cells carry oxygen throughout the body.
- · White blood cells are responsible for fighting off infection and function in one's immune system.
- · Platelets assist in the clotting of blood, that is, they help stop bleeding.



These cells can continue to create an endless supply of stem cells identical to the precursor or develop into many different types of more specialized stem cells {transdifferentiate}. These include blood stem cells, liver stem cells, brain stem cells, neural tissue stem cells, heart tissue stem cells, skin stem cells, connective tissue stem cells, and pancreatic tissue stem cells. Blood stem cells are essential for the immune system as well as for the entire blood system to continue to exist and function. The absence of blood stem cells renders an individual helpless against fighting infection leading to a collapse of the immune system and subsequent death.

Stem cells, whether obtained from bone marrow or umbilical cord blood, save lives. Until recently, blood stem cells have been obtained primarily from bone marrow. Unfortunately, it takes an average of four months and sometimes up to two years to locate a suitably matched donor. This is very precious time, which dying patients do not have. Most patients in need of a lifesaving bone marrow stem cell transplant will die because they are unable to locate, in time if at all, a suitably matched donor. Every year in America alone, thousands of individuals die unnecessarily due to the absence of a large, genetically diversified stem cell bank.

The Bone Marrow Donors Worldwide Registry reports that there are only approximately 8,500 successful matches out of 45,000 searches annually, leaving the vast majority unable to find a suitable match. The National Marrow Donor Program reports that approximately 3,000 searches occur daily.

Umbilical Cord Blood Stem Cells have already been used in the successful treatment of over 65 diseases. These include cancers of the blood such as Leukemias, Lymphomas and Myelomas. They also have been used to successfully treat genetic and acquired diseases such as Sickle Cell Anemia, Thalassemia and over 50 other Umbilical Cord Blood Stem Cells have diseases. already been proven to transdifferentiate in humans to other types of tissue cells such as heart and nerve cells. This gives physicians and scientists the understandable hope that Umbilical Cord Blood Stem Cells will be used going forward as cellular therapies, treating diseases such as Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, heart attacks, strokes, spinal cord injuries, diabetes, solid tumor cancers, multiple sclerosis, Lou Gehrig's Disease {ALS}, and severe burn injuries. Patient with these injuries add up to over 40 million in the United States alone.


Stem cell research has been a prominent and hotly debated topic in the media. The controversy has been generated over the ethics of using stem cells obtained from embryonic tissue. The collection of stem cells from umbilical cord blood does not elicit the ethical,

religious, or political controversy associated with obtaining stem cells from embryos. In fact, current legislation, which would make funds available to increase inventories of publicly available umbilical cord blood stem cell units, has Bi-Partisan support, already passing in the House with a vote of 431-1. Because the donated umbilical cord blood {which would normally be discarded as medical waste} does not harm the mother or baby, it also has religious support.

Umbilical Cord Blood Stem Cells have already been used in over 6000 transplants saving thousands of children and adults who would have otherwise died. However, the existing umbilical cord blood banks in the United States have relatively small inventories that are available for the public's use. Most of the umbilical cord blood currently in storage has been privately stored for only the family who stored it. There is an urgent need for larger and more ethnically diverse public Umbilical Cord Blood Stem Cell inventories.

As an Obstetrician, I have had the opportunity to counsel expectant mothers and know that the majority of them are ready and willing to donate their umbilical cord blood. The availability of this controversy-free umbilical cord blood, the urgent need to increase both the size and the diversity of inventories, and the thousands of patients who would benefit from it annually, is the reason why I and my partner, Michael Ernst {who left a successful 17 year career in banking} created CORDUS. He and I have been deeply distressed why so many people have to continue to die needlessly and are passionate about helping to meet this urgent need. We believe that rarely does the opportunity present itself to be involved with an entity that will save so many lives, while improving the quality of life for countless others, utilizing proven medical science.




His brilliance in producing and directing was complemented in great part through his unique rapport with the stars - coaxing tremendous performances from talent and crews alike.






#### Hello, how are you?

Along the waterway to Moscow amongst all the villages - we found beautiful markets with wonderful, inexpensive treasures to purchase. People were friendly and welcoming, at one village ... we walked to a home where a woman was working in her garden. She spoke no English and we spoke no Russian, but somehow we communicated and she invited us into her home. She showed us her telephone, which she was very proud of, along with family pictures. A grand experience.

Moscow is a sharp contrast to St. Petersburg. Home to over 12 million people, it is a very cosmopolitan city. Traffic was the same as in every other large city.

The Kremlin is the original fortress and the oldest part of the city. The Armory, a museum within the Kremlin, has Faberge eggs, carriages and artifacts. The collection goes back to the fourth century. In 1813 the Armory building became an exhibition hall and museum. The treasures contained within are overwhelming, presented with an array of objects that is staggering in its historical interest and spectacular richness. Next door, at the Diamond Treasury, the 190-carat Orlov Diamond can be observed.

innocent and flawless. It comes with hands open wide, holding nothing, but beholds mankind and the terrestrial edifice for the first time. The Angel steps into the world having no name or place to stay except the one a human may offer to give.

Global efforts are focused on combating anti-development trends spelled out in the United Nations Millennium Development Goals {MDGs} which have a striking need for poverty reduction! Challenges to these goals are enormous and interconnected.

In the Niger Delta region of Nigeria - it is commonplace to see a teenager give birth to about 2-3 children in a space of 3-4 years. This often leaves girls, in particular, in social isolation with little education and limited opportunities of earning a decent livelihood.

magine seeing an angel crying for help! You wonder: why should an angel ever shed a tear?

Humans often depend on angels. But the reverse is the case here.



The standard of living in this region is very low with severely malnourished children. Educational standards are disappointing as high school students are unable to write well or speak English fluently. Sources of livelihood are fast diminishing, health systems and facilities are archaic with huge infant mortality rates.

In a World Trade Organization symposium, Clare Short stated that "One in four of the World's population {two-thirds of them women} live in abject poverty without access to adequate food, clean water, sanitation, essential health care or basic education services.

That's 1.2 billion people whose lives are blighted by poverty, robbed of their dignity, deprived of the opportunity to fulfill their potential."

Have you made a mental note of this figure?

In spite of these problems, there is a high rate of population growth in the Niger Delta...

This directly leads to stiff competition for scarce resources due to over-population which can easily lead to conflict. There is a wide gap between the rate of population growth and the rate of development in the region, especially in terms of livelihood opportunities.

The fact is - the poorest countries need faster economic growth than population growth or, poverty grows invincibly. Economic empowerment opportunities are fast diminishing due to depletion of the natural resources base.

To reach the MDGs for poverty elimination, DFID {Department for International Development} argues for a sharper focus on the 600 million children who make up half the world's poorest people.

These trends imply that achievement of the MDGs is far from this region and concerted efforts are needed to reverse these trends immediately. Targeted research and studies will provide adequate information on the present situation, and strategies can then be adopted to improve education - especially for the female child who is often left to bear the burden after childbirth.


Massive awareness creation and consultation with the people to improve their lot will be facilitated and progress toward achieving the MDGs in the Niger Delta region will be accelerated.

The point, therefore, is not the amount of money that has been dedicated to these Millennium targets but rather - ensuring that these issues are actually dealt with by informed and trustworthy people. Bridging the wide gaps between policy makers and the intended beneficiaries!

Due to high levels of casual sex - owing to the level of our poverty - the incidence of HIV/AIDS infection is on the high rise. Several children born as a result of this act are often infected with the virus. And then, the innocence of these children's hopes of experiencing a good life are dashed ... and all that is left is pain and dissatisfaction.

We both see hope coming for these Angels, because you and the two of us can make a great difference, before Angels cry ~

# POWER & MONEY Warren Edward Buffett

"Risk comes from not knowing what you're doing."

- Warren Buffett

Warren Edward Buffett was born August 30th, 1930, to Howard and Leila Buffett, in Omaha, Nebraska, the middle child of the Buffett's three. His father Howard, was a stockbroker turned US Congressman with a fascination for numbers and a keen eye for business. His son would live to immensely multiply his father's dreams.

Trivia: How did Buffett meet his companion?



arren Buffett always wanted to be rich and he knew what it took to make his dream come true. Today he is somewhat of an American folk hero. He is the antithesis of the typical Wall Street investor, preferring to operate his company out of Omaha, Nebraska, instead of New York City.

He bought his first 3 shares of stock at age 11 and made a modest \$5 gain upon sale. He has come a long way since then, having amassed a fortune of \$36 billion, largely due to his uncanny ability to pick the right stocks at the right time.

Some people may not know Warren Buffett, but they have all heard of the companies in which he owns large blocks of shares. Companies such as Coca-Cola, American Express, Gillette, The Washington Post Company, Wells Fargo and Company, Sees Candy, Benjamin Moore & Co., GEICO Direct Auto Insurance, General & Cologne Re Group and Dairy Queen.

What makes Mr. Buffett different from other investors is that his investing approach works wonders. He has beaten the average return of the S&P 500 for 30 out of the last 31 years. He does not invest in businesses he doesn't understand, which is why he has not bought part of his good friend Bill Gates' Microsoft.

He drinks about 15 cans of Coca-Cola per day and plays bridge religiously. His wrinkled suits, square eye-glasses and bushy eyebrows, accompanied by his contagious smile and awkward chuckle have all added to the Buffett charm. His annual shareholder meetings are legendary and attract almost as many people as a pro sporting event.

#### personal style

Warren Buffett has three children and lives with his companion Astrid Menks, a waitress. Although it seems confusing, it's perfectly normal to Warren, Susie {prior to her demise last year} and Astrid, who were all friends and signed presents from the three of them. In fact, Susie was the one who introduced Astrid to Warren and the two women remained friends until Susie's death.

While Buffett may be the 'Oracle of Omaha' in all his riches, 99% of all his wealth will go to The Buffett Foundation, which has served mostly family planning clinics since the 1960s. Today, his fortune funds the Foundation to the tune of \$11-12 million a year.

#### coolness factor

Let's take a step back and think about what 'cool' really is. Usually, cool is someone who goes against the grain in an admirable way. When everyone was buying up Internet companies and riding the wave, he was heavily criticized. He stood back, did not change his position, knowing full well that the tide would come crashing. He knows what he wants and sticks to his guns and in the world of investing, patience pays off.

Warren Buffett is not called the 'Oracle of Omaha' for nothing. He is, without a doubt, the best stock picker/investor the world has ever known. He took a few measly dollars and turned them into a \$36 billion fortune almost single-handedly.

#### accomplishments and fame


Just about every waking minute of his existence has been devoted to business.

Most other billionaires have built their fortunes by employing hundreds of thousands of people. Mr. Buffett has amazingly built a \$36 billion fortune virtually on his own by buying shares of other companies. His company, Berkshire Hathaway, commonly referred to as an investment vehicle, only employs 13 people full-time.

So how can a firm that employs less people than your local grocery store generate billions in annual profits and consistently rank in the top 10 of Fortune's Most Admired American Companies list year after year? It's due to the brilliant intellect and tireless work ethic of Warren Buffett.

Unlike fellow billionaire Larry Ellison, Warren Buffett is not known for his sartorial dexterity. 

As the speed and strength of professional athletes increase, so do the severities of the injuries suffered. What concerns me most - are the frequency of sports concussions due to violent collisions between players. Many times they go unnoticed, due to the macho mentality most players are bred to deal with. Over time, these concussions can have serious, long term effects on the athlete. We know just by listening to former boxers what serious head trauma can do to a person. Preventive methods and/or early detection are critical!


First, it is essential that a coach and parent ensure that the player has proper protective head gear. Always, buy quality protective equipment. If the equipment seems to be new, inspect the equipment for any cracks or damage on the equipment. Also, it is a great idea and often recommended to supply the athlete with a mouth guard to help the jaw and teeth from violently coming together. These rules apply for non contact sports as well.


If you believe a head injury has happened - here are a couple of things you should know.

## « POLITICALLY RED

By Lani Silver San Francisco - California



In the spring of 1994 my colleagues, Eric Saul, Noby Yoshimura, Harry Fukahara and I discovered the story of Chiune and Yukiko Sugihara. Chiune Sugihara is known as the 'Japanese Schindler' because of his rescue of thousands of Polish Jews who fled Nazi occupied Europe. Sugihara and Zwartendyk issued visas for the refugees, when they were in Kaunas Lithuania in 1940. Sugihara issued the visas against the orders of Japan.


Twenty-five of us went to Japan to find Mrs. Sugihara. We deplaned at Narita airport and were greeted by close to one hundred reporters. We drove two hours to our hotel in Tokyo where we were ushered into a huge ball-room where the press corps doubled. That week CBS Evening News, Time Magazine, CNN, National Public Radio and others aired the first stories in the West about Sugihara. The story follows.




In 1939, Jan Zwartendyk was the Acting Consul General of Holland. Chiune Sugihara was a rising star in the Japanese Foreign Ministry. Zwartendyk started issuing visas to Polish Jews in the late spring. In July, the Sugiharas woke up to the sounds of two hundred Polish Jews who had assembled in front of the Japanese Consulate. They asked Consul Sugihara for visas so they could escape Nazi-occupied Europe.

Sugihara issued visas day and night throughout the month. In August of 1939, Russia, which overtook Lithuania, closed down all the consulates in Kaunas except for the Japanese Consulate - permitted to remain open through August. Then the Sugihara family boarded the train to Germany, to Chiune's next assignment. In all, Chiune Sugihara handwrote 2,193 transit visas for Jewish families.

The Sugiharas spent several months in Berlin and then moved to their new posts in Koeningsberg, Germany, Prague and Romania. After the war, the Sugiharas spent 18 months in a Russian Prison Camp in Romania. The Sugiharas returned home to Japan in 1946 and experienced great tragedy in their personal lives with the death of their youngest son, Haruki and Yukiko's sister, Setsku. Soon, thereafter, Chiune was dismissed from the Foreign Ministry 'because of that incident in Lithuania.' Sugihara was shattered, and his family's livelihood was immediately jeopardized. Sugihara struggled to make a living and lived his life unrecognized. Sugihara died at 85 in 1985 with Japan not recognizing him until a few years ago.




Los Angeles Press: For the new Sugihara sculpture.

# Is Capitalism Failing?

Enron was to forfeit \$32.5 million in unjust profits.



t's hard to figure how a term that once connoted so much good for the world has fallen into such disrepute. In the past decade, globalization--meaning the rise of market capitalism around the world--has undeniably contributed to America's New Economy boom. It has created millions of jobs from Malaysia to Mexico and a cornucopia of affordable goods for Western consumers. It has transferred nearly \$2 trillion from rich countries to poor.

Where then is it failing? The market system, even with its imperfections, is the most efficient way of organizing an economy to satisfy individual needs. President Bush stated: "There's no capitalism without conscience; there is no wealth without character." Morality must direct the socio-economic order.

It is hard to define a moral consensus, let alone enforce one. And this is especially true in business. The root problem is a loss of belief in objective ethical standards. The growing dominance of markets has contributed to this moral collapse.

William Bennett, observed that Capitalism, "is an economic system that requires virtues and character that it does not, of itself, develop in capitalists. The "greed is good" mentality has penetrated business schools. "Capitalism requires capitalists with moral and ethical tethers."

#### **UNETHICAL BEHAVIOR IS RAMPANT!**

- Enron's Executive Ken Lay deceived his shareholders and employees out of millions of dollars.
- Tyco CEO Dennis Kozlowski had his lavish lifestyle charged to Tyco. As the Wall Street Journal noted, it's not easy to spend \$15,000 on an umbrella stand, at company expense. The umbrella stand decorated the hall of his \$18 million Fifth Avenue apartment in New York.
- Athletes are paid exorbitant salaries.
- Government employees have retirement benefits equal to 95% of their salary; with COLA clauses.
- Members of Congress have not set an example. Their retirement is more than generous for little time served.

#### IS THERE ANY SOLUTION?

There are solutions but not enough enforcement and not enough ethical standards.

For example, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission affirmed the findings of an administrative law judge and ordered Enron to forfeit \$32.5 million in unjust profits.

Tyco CEO Dennis Kozlowski received 8-1/3 to 25 years in prison for his part in stealing hundreds of millions of dollars from the manufacturing conglomerate. He was ordered to pay \$134 million back to Tyco, and was fined \$70 million -- bringing total fines and restitution to \$239 million. The former Tyco executives were ordered to start serving their sentences immediately and were led from the courtroom in handcuffs.



## « CAPRICCIO

By Danilo Navas Nicaragua - Central America



he largest country in Central America, Nicaragua has a rich and diverse musical heritage. A reflection of its culture, Nicaraguan music is a mixture of European -mostly Spanish, Native American and African elements. The influence/importance of each element varies from region to region. Folkloric and popular dances go hand-in-hand with musical rhythms and specific instrumentations. The National Dance, called "Baile de marimba", is closely identified with Masaya, a town of artisans where we find the indigenous village of "Monimbó". The instruments used to perform "marimba" music are: guitar, bass fiddle, guitarrilla {a small guitar like a mandolin} and marimba {from African descent} which is a percussive instrument made with wooden plates and gourds hanging below.

There are many theatrical expressions that combine music and dances, usually depicting Spanish conquistadors and Native Americans. "El Gueguense/Macho Raton" and el Toro Guaco" are two of them. Traditional flutes, maracas and other percussive instruments are used to accompany the performers. Dresses and costumes are always very colorful and bright, with rich ornamentation.

Religious local festivities, which are a mixture of worship and recreation, are great sources of musical activity. Chants to the Virgin Mary, chants to Child Jesus {villancicos or lullabies} and "sones de pascua" are sung with devotion in most of the national territory. During the bulls "corridas", bands using European instrumentation {mostly horns and percussion} play "sones de toros".

Mexican influence is noticeable in Nicaraguan music. The same can be said about Nicaraguan culture in general. Guitar is utilized as a main instrument {sometimes with violin}, to accompany "son nica", mazurkas, polkas, corridos and traditional Spanish romances, which we find in the northern regions.

The Atlantic zone of Nicaragua has its own musical expressions, deeply rooted in the Caribbean traditions, with a strong African, black influence. "Palo de Mayo" {May Pole} is a dance/celebration related to fertility, during the beginning of the rainy season. The earth gives birth to crops. It is charged with sensuality and eroticism, and is very rhythmic. "Miskito" and "Garifuna" tribes have also their own music in this remote area.



Some prominent Nicaraguan musicians and composers are: Camilo Zapata, who is accredited as the creator of the "son nica", a basic rhythmic pattern executed in guitar; Dimension Costeña, a well-known orchestra which performs the music known as "Palo de Mayo"; Otto de La Rocha, whose songs draw from popular tradition; brothers Luis Enrique and Carlos Mejia Godoy, two of the most important composers and interpreters of the "Nueva Cancion" movement.






've just returned from an invitation to Kazakhstan, a Republic in Central Asia, where I was invited by Let the President's family to photograph their native land. The President's niece took me to a sheep camp deep in the mountains where I would live for a month. We sat on rugs with the sheep herders for tea in Kazakh style, and I flirted with the hopelessly shy young girl serving tea, to break the ice. The house was adobe and simple. After much effort I got her to explain how she met her husband. She said, "We married in the traditional way". I asked, "What way is that"? She replied, "He stole me".

Before the communists forcibly urbanized and crushed Kazakh culture, nearly all Kazakhs were nomads. In those days tribes would gather and if a man liked a girl he simply threw her over his saddle and carried her off. If she did not fight him off fiercely enough, he took her to his tent or a secluded spot and forced himself on her. Once this happens, they must marry. If the girl broke the relationship, it brought shame to her and her family. If the man tried to walk away from the affair, it would be settled violently by the relatives of the girl. The young lady proudly explained that she had never seen or heard of her husband before he stole her and that it was very romantic for he brought his horse into town to steal her in the traditional style.

My first question was what if she did not love him. Everyone at the table shouted: that in an extreme case, the girl may leave but logic dictates that the couple must find a way to make it work. I asked if courtship would not be better? But courtship was not honorable. I was confused. The niece of the president, a pop star, broke in: "look at me; I am beyond normal marriage age because I abandoned our traditional life while I studied abroad. Our girls who live in big cities are doing the same. Romantic love is not something to base a family on. Marriage is based on honor and respect."

# HOW FLOWERS **Get Their Names**

ith Spring being right around the corner well, that's what astronomers say! - my mind started to picture beautiful red tulips, vibrant daffodils, heavenly scented hyacinth and freesias ... and while I was thinking of all these flowers, I realized that I never knew how a flower got its name.

I knew that flowers, just like all other plants, have both common and Latin names. And I also knew the Latin ones are universal and composed of a genus name, followed by a species name. What I didn't know is that these Latin names aren't nearly so perplexing if you know a bit about their derivation.

Many names are descriptive. They may refer to color such as 'xantho' or yellow, 'virens' or green, 'nigra' or black, or 'alba' or white.

Color words may be combined with plant parts such as 'canthus' or spine, not to be confused with 'anthus' or flower. 'Carpus' refers to fruit and 'rhizus' to root. Combined, you might have 'xanthorhizus' or yellow root, 'rubrifolia' or red leaves, 'lactiflorus' or white flowered. You see, it's very simple!

Other descriptors may refer to shape, such as 'stella' for star; to size as 'macr' for long or big, 'lept' for thin or slender; number as 'poly' for many; feel or texture as about 'macranthus?' You're right--wooly fruit and big

I also learned that names can refer to someone or something interesting about the plant. Did you know that Impatiens is the Latin for impatient, or that Dianthus is one of those compound words from the Greek language meaning the flower {anthos} of the god Zeus {Di}?

If I sparked your interest and you would like to learn more - there are many dictionaries of plant names check your local library.
